Dear Ms. Kaouris:

The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has reviewed the site soil and groundwater remediation documents submitted by Honeywell pursuant to Paragraph 23.E of the 2011 Consent Judgment, and associated documents regarding remediation of chromate chemical production waste (CCPW) and CCPW-related metals (defined as hexavalent chromium, antimony, chromium, nickel, thallium, and vanadium) in soil at HCC Sites 073, 087, 088, 124, 125, 134, 140 and 163 (See Attachment 1 for details), information in the Department's case file, and the certified representations and information provided to the Department.

Based on the information provided, the Department concludes that the remediation of the CCPW and CCPW-related metals in soil and groundwater is protective of public health, safety, and the

environment. The Department further concludes that the remediation satisfies the requirements of the Consent Judgment in New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, et al. v. Honeywell International Inc., et al., Docket No C-77-05, Superior Court of New Jersey, Chancery Division-Hudson County (filed September 7, 2011) ("Consent Judgment"), the Technical Requirements for Site Remediation at N.J.A.C. 7:26E, and the Administrative Requirements for Remediation of Contaminated Sites at N.J.A.C. 7:26C. As a result, the Department has determined that the remediation of the CCPW and CCPW-related metals in soil and groundwater are not subject to further review pursuant to N.J.S.A. 58:10C-21 and 58:10C-25.

By operation of law, a Covenant Not to Sue pursuant to N.J.S.A. 58:10B-13.2 applies to this remediation of CCPW and CCPW-related metals in soil and groundwater. The Covenant Not to Sue is subject to any conditions and limitations contained herein, and remains effective as long as the real property referenced above continues to meet those conditions. This includes the need to continue to comply with any permit Honeywell is required to obtain or has obtained (See Attachment 1 for details). Anticipated permits include those listed in Attachment 1, and monitoring well installation permits for any new monitoring wells and well decommissioning notice per N.J.A.C. 7:9D-3 for the eventual decommissioning of any site monitoring wells.

This letter serves as the functional equivalent to No Further Action ("NFA") letters issued pursuant to N.J.S.A. §58:10B-13.1 and N.J.A.C. 7:26C before those provisions were amended effective in 2012 to no longer authorize NFA letters. The Department recognizes this letter as serving the same function as previously served by NFA letters, and satisfies the same legal obligations formerly met by NFA letters, for sites regulated directly by NJDEP.

Dear Mr. Doyle:

As you requested during our telephone conversation on August 30, 2018, Honeywell is submitting this letter to request that NJDEP issue a Letter of Compliance for the SA-6 North and SA-6 South Chromium Remedies. The following are the Remedial Action Reports (RARs) submitted to NJDEP that document completion of the Chromium Remedies at SA-6 North and SA-6 South:

- 1. Remedial Action Report SA-6 South Chromium Remedy, February 8, 2017 (NJDEP approval letter dated March 30, 2017);
- 2. Remedial Action Report SA-6 North Chromium Remedy, March 16, 2017 (NJDEP approval letter dated June 1, 2017);
- 3. Shallow Groundwater RAR, SA-6 South Development AOC, July 20, 2018 (NJDEP approval letter dated September 13, 2018); and
- 4. Addendum to March 2017 Remedial Action Report, Focused Excavation Implementation at TA-10-1, SA-6 North, July 24, 2018 (NJDEP approval letter dated September 13, 2018).

As indicated on the attached tables, all Remedial Action Permits for soil and groundwater related to SA-6 North and SA-6 South have been issued by NJDEP. The Blocks/Lots and Program Interest Numbers related to each Remedial Action Permit are also listed on the tables. In addition, we have included a figure showing the ten chromium deed notice areas that correspond to the ten RA Permits for soil and figures showing the two shallow groundwater classification exception areas for chromium that correspond to the two RA Permits for groundwater.



FIGURE SHOWING CHROMIUM DEED NOTICE AREAS




FIGURES SHOWING SHALLOW GROUNDWATER CLASSIFICATION EXCEPTION AREAS




